

## Personal Immigration Border Tips

### Travel for Personal Purpose FAQs

1. **U.S. citizens** do not need a visitor visa to enter Canada
  - a. Identification required for travel to Canada:
    - i. Passport
    - ii. Nexus card
    - iii. FAST card
    - iv. Enhanced Driver's License
  
2. **International visitors** may need a visa. Visit the [cic.gc.ca](http://cic.gc.ca) website to determine if your country or residence is one that requires an eTA or a visitor visa
  - a. Identification required for travel to Canada:
    - i. Passport
  
3. **Travel with Minors**
  - a. If custody is shared, carry copies of legal custody documents
  - b. If the minor is not your child or if custody is shared, then a consent letter is required:
    - i. The letter must show that the individual traveling with the minor has permission to carry the child independently from their parents or guardians
    - ii. The letter should be signed by every individual not accompanying the child who has the legal right to make decisions for the minor
    - iii. Witness signatures are required
    - iv. It is recommended to have the letter certified by a notary or lawyer
