



Business Travelers Border Tips

Travel for Business Purpose FAQs

1. Determine if an eTA or a visitor visa is required (US citizens do not require either)
2. **Business Visitors** must show:
 - a. Your anticipated stay will be less than six months;
 - b. You do not plan to work in Canada;
 - c. Your source of income and profits and where your work is located outside of Canada;
 - d. Your valid travel document (e.g. passport)
 - e. You are financially able to support yourself during your stay and your return home;
 - f. You will leave Canada at the end of your visit;
 - g. You are not a health or security risk to Canada, nor a criminal
3. To qualify as a business visitor, carry with you your travel document (passport) and a **business letter**
 - a. *Requirements for the letter*; what to include:
 - i. A list of the businesses you plan to visit including the address and contact information;
 - ii. Where you will be staying during your visit;
 - iii. A statement that your primary source of income and profits is outside of Canada
